## ORANGE SHIRT SUNDAY

Sunday September 28th is Orange Shirt Sunday, a day where we honour residential school Survivors, their families and communities by wearing orange shirts as a way to declare Every Child Matters. On this day will be supporting Water First, a Canadian agency dedicated to working in partnership with Indigenous

communities. In Canada, 17% of First Nation communities are impacted by a drinking water advisory. Water First understands that no one knows the challenges and needs more than the people who live in those communities and they have made it their mission to address local water challenges through education, training and partnerships. For those who would like to contribute to this meaningful work a bucket will be located on the back table in the sanctuary to collect any donations.
